WOVEN by Debby Lee

Supply List:

Sewing Machine, (Featherweights WELCOME!), cords, foot pedal

Neutral thread

Prewind 3 bobbins with the neutral thread

BSS (basic Sewing Supplies)

Rotary cutter

Rotary Mat

Iron

Ironing surface

FABRIC: All you need for class is 2 jelly rolls and background.

2 Jelly Rolls (40 strips in each jelly roll = 80 strips needed) You do not have to have 2 identical Jelly Rolls. But teacher did purchase 2 identical Jelly Rolls. Your choice. *** FQ's will NOT work. We need the full length of the jelly roll strips. *****

2 3/8 yds. Background. Not a Jelly roll, nor FQ's. Please use purchased yardage. Teacher used white on muslin.

1 yd. Binding. Any print.

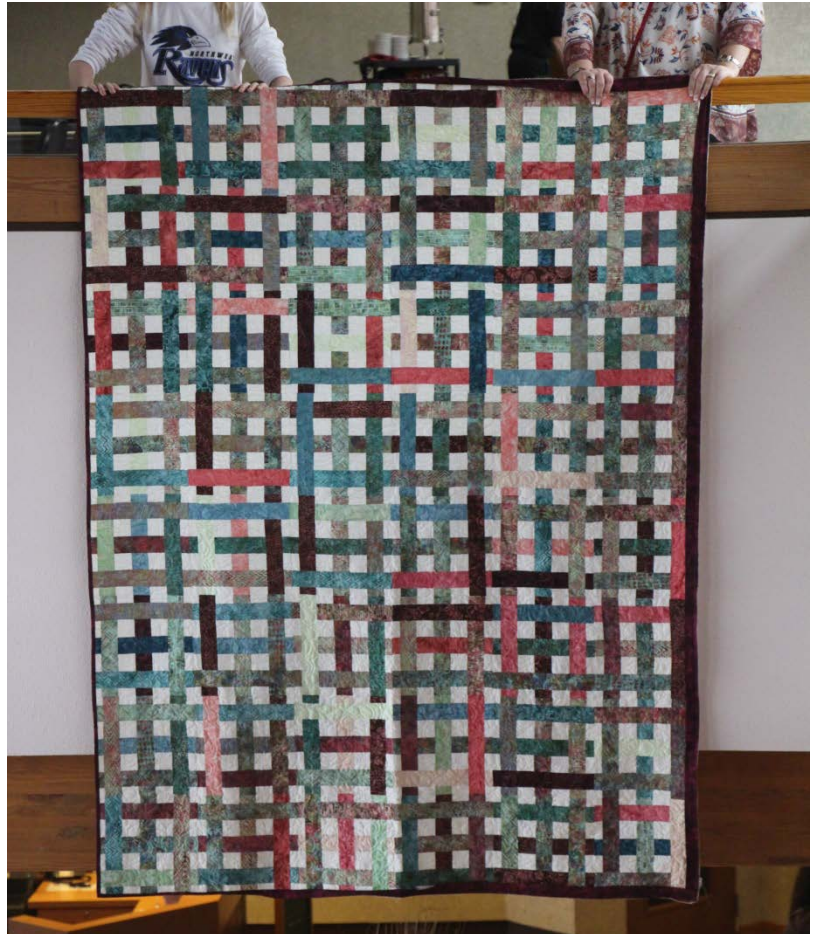
OPTIONAL; Border fabric; 2 yards

Our project, Woven, does not have borders. The quilt is 72in. x 96in. without borders.

BUT you may add borders if you choose. 6 inch borders will make your quilt 84in. x 108in. Teacher calculated that 2 yards of Border fabric should do mitered borders.

Woven CUTTING DIRECTIONS by Debby Lee

2 Jelly Rolls. Each jelly roll needs to have at least 40 – 2.5 inch strips. (80 strips total)

Begin by unrolling your jelly roll. Leave them folded in half. WRONG sides together. Cut according to the directions below.

IT DOES NOT MATTER WHICH COLOR or WHICH FABRIC YOU CUT WHICH SIZE.

- From 24 strips cut; 2 - 8" rectangles and 2 - 12.5" rectangles from each strip.
Yield 48 rectangles of EACH SIZE.
Put them into baggies by size.
- From 24 strips cut: 4 – 9.5" rectangles from each strip.
Yield 96 rectangles.
Put into baggie.
- From 32 strips cut; 3 – 11" rectangles from each strip.
Yield 96 rectangles.
Put into baggie.

Background Fabric: 2 3/8 yds.

- Cut 10 – 8" x WOF (width of fabric) strips.
- THEN SUBCUT each 8" strip into 10 – 4" x 8" rectangles.
Yield; 100 – 4" x 8" rectangles.
We will use 96 of these.
Put in a baggie.
